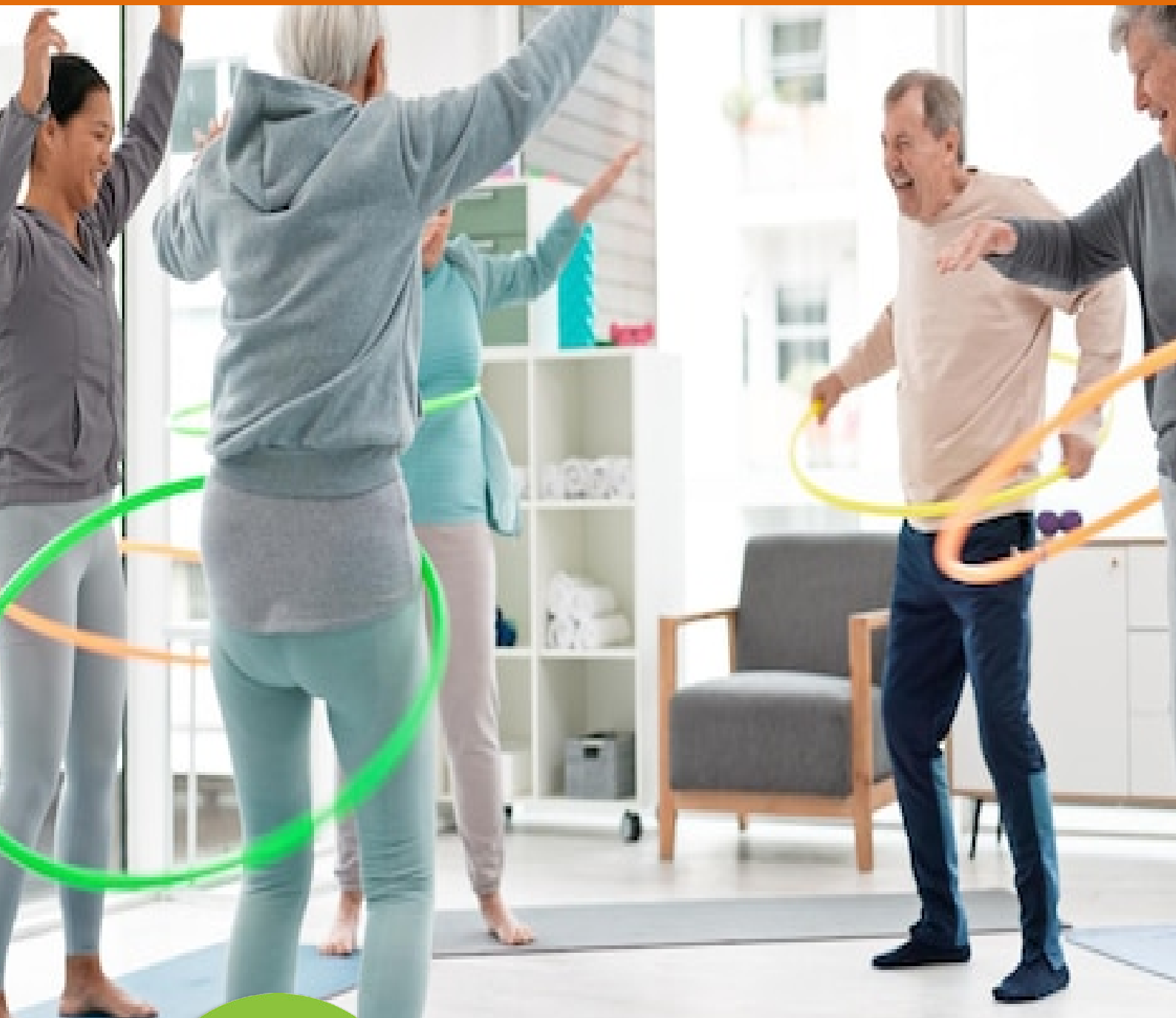

Enhance the wellbeing of others through meaningful activities and social connection!

If you're ready to turn your passion for helping others into a fulfilling career, this course is your next step. Learn how to create moments of joy, connection, and purpose for those who need it most. The course is your gateway to a rewarding career in aged care, disability support, and community services, where you'll help individuals live fuller, more vibrant lives. This nationally recognised qualification equips you with the skills to design, implement, and evaluate leisure and health programs that promote independence, inclusion, and quality of life. Whether you're working with older adults, people living with dementia, or individuals with diverse needs, you'll learn how to make a real impact in their lives.

Qualification description

This qualification reflects the role of workers participating in the design, implementation and evaluation of leisure, health activities and programs for clients in one or more sector areas. Workers may be in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres, completing specialised tasks and functions in relation to leisure and health. While workers are responsible for their own outputs, work is carried out under direct or indirect supervision within defined organisation guidelines.

Pathways

Potential study pathways – CHC53415 Diploma of Leisure and Health.

Potential employment pathways – graduates can expect to apply for roles in the aged/disability care and community service sectors in occupational titles such as Leisure and Health Officer, Activities Coordinator, Diversional Therapist Assistant, Lifestyle Support Worker, Community Recreation Officer.

Entry requirements

Prior to applying to enrol, you must complete a **Pre-Training Review (PTR)** to help us identify any skills or knowledge you already have, check if this course is the right fit for your goals and to help ensure you can succeed in your learning. The PTR includes a Language, literacy, numeracy and digital skills (LLND) assessment.

- **Physical:** a reasonable level of physical capability is needed for workplace experience within the aged/disability care industry which encompasses manual handling of equipment and clients.
- **Technology:** a laptop or tablet is required for all classes in order to access your course materials and assessments online. Connect to our free student WiFi.

Course delivery and duration

This course is delivered onsite in a classroom setting, so you'll be learning face-to-face with your trainer and classmates. The 17 units in this course are scheduled over a duration of approximately 9 months. Classes are one day per week and you'll need to set aside 10–15 hours per week for research, assessments and revision outside of class.

You'll attend:

- ✓ 27 weekly classes (7 hours each)
- ✓ 2 review sessions to check your progress and help you stay on track
- ✓ At least 120 hours of work placement in addition to your classes
- 📅 No classes during VIC school holidays or public holidays - so you'll have time to recharge!

Assessment & Cloud Assess LMS

You'll receive a Student Unit Guide and a set of assessment tasks to complete for every unit. All course materials and assessments are accessed and submitted through Cloud Assess, our online learning platform. To be marked as Competent in a unit, you must achieve a Satisfactory result for every assessment task. These tasks may include written questions, projects, case studies, role plays, presentations, and practical placement. You'll find all assessment due dates in your course timetable and within Cloud Assess. You will be supported throughout the course by your Trainer and Training Coordinator.

Placement

You must complete at least 120 hours of placement which may be done via voluntary placement, OR through your place of employment if you work in a relevant community/aged/disability care setting. Your placement must first be approved by us via our Workplace DEED, before you can commence. You may be required to attend an

interview and induction with your host placement provider prior to placement. We'll provide you with a polo shirt to wear at placement, so you'll look the part!

For employment and/or placement purposes, this vocational sector typically requires that you have a current and satisfactory Police Check, Working with Children Check, NDIS Work Screening Check, evidence of influenza vaccination and COVID-19 vaccination (unless an exception applies). For more information about vaccinations, go to www.health.vic.gov.au/immunisation/vaccination-for-healthcare-workers. You should first check these requirements first with your anticipated placement provider so that you can organise what they require in advance.

Course Fees / Fee payments / Payment plans

This training is delivered with Victorian and Commonwealth Government funding if you are eligible for a Skills First subsidised training place and choose to access your entitlement. Your course fees are determined by us at the time of enrolment and are based on whether you are/are not eligible for Victorian Skills First government funding.

- **Administration fee:** this fee is non-refundable and must be paid in full at the time of enrolment. If you cannot afford this, please speak with your enrolling officer.

- **Government funded tuition fees:** must be paid in full at the time of enrolment. If you cannot afford this, you can enter into an Ezidebit payment plan or Centrepay arrangement. Minimum payment is \$55 per fortnight until fully paid. Your first payment must be made by Day 1 of the scheduled course start date.
- **Fee for Service tuition fees:** you must enter into a payment plan. Elect to pay 8 monthly instalments of \$750, OR 16 fortnightly instalments of \$375. Your first payment must be made by Day 1 of the scheduled course start date.
